

Slow Cooker Beef Stroganoff ~Betty Crocker

2 pounds beef stew meat

I cup chopped onion

I can (10 3/4 ounces) cream of mushroom soup

I can (10 3/4 ounces) condensed cream of onion soup

I jar (6 ounces) Green Giant® sliced mushrooms, drained

1/4 teaspoon pepper

I package (8 ounces) cream cheese, cubed

I container (8 ounces) sour cream

6 cups hot cooked noodles



In 3 1/2- to 4 1/2-quart slow cooker, mix beef, onion, soups, mushrooms and pepper. Cover and cook on low heat setting 8 to 10 hours or until beef is very tender. Then, stir cream cheese into beef mixture until melted. Next, stir sour cream into beef mixture. Serve over noodles.
