FOR THE GLORY OF GOD


- Malachi 1:11 "For from the rising of the sun to its setting my name will be great among the nations, and in every place incense will be offered to my name, and a pure offering. For my name will be great among the nations, says the LORD of hosts."
- 1 Corinthians 10:31 "So, whether you eat or drink, or whatever you do, do all to the glory of God."

 God."

This broad statement includes everything in the Christian life, including how you raise your children!

 Glory – heavy, weighty, honorable, worthy of respect and praise

 Gravitas – weight, seriousness, dignity, importance





- Exodus 34:29 Why did Moses' face shine?
- Exodus 33:18-20; 34:5-8

Moses was set aglow by His encounter with God's glory


- To glorify God is to experience His excellencies and radiate them in heart, in word and in deed
- "God is most fully glorified in me when I am most fully satisfied in Him" – John Piper

- The indestructible connection between loving and glorifying God
 - + John 15:8–10 "By this my Father is glorified, that you bear much fruit and so prove to be my disciples. As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Abide in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love."

Loving God brings glory to God

- Deuteronomy 6:1-15 A charge to the parents of the nation of Israel
 - + v1-3 The fate of a nation hung upon their proper understanding and adherence to the truth God was revealing to them.
 - + v4 "Hear, O Israel! The Lord is our God, the Lord is one!" predicated upon Deuteronomy 5:22-24
 - + v5-6 The path to parenting for the glory of God:
 - You must know and love Him with your entire being!


- The Christian Ramp
 - + Romans 8:28–29 "And we know that <u>for those</u> who love God all things work together for good, for those who are called according to his purpose. For those whom he foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son, in order that he might be the firstborn among many brothers."
 - + good Making you more like Christ



- The Christian Ramp (continued)
 - + Proverbs 22:6 "Train up a child in the way he should go; even when he is old he will not depart from it."
 - + Recognize that Proverbs speaks in generalities

 Just because there are exceptions, don't forget that

 most of us will end up with the majority!
 - + How do we apply this to parenting?



A SERIOUS WARNING

- Deuteronomy 6:1-15 (continued)
 - + v7-9 TOMORROW
 - + v10-15 Beware of Blessing
 - When does blessing become a curse?
 - * When it becomes more important than the Blesser
 - The danger was that their attention would be diverted from God by their blessings!

A SERIOUS WARNING

- Compare:
 - + Moses' response to God's glory (Deut. 5:22-27)
 - + Israel's response to God's glory (Judges 2:6-10)
- Who paid the price?
 - + Their children and their grandchildren

Humans have the uncanny ability to make an idol out of anything.

The challenge to parenting is not our inability or lack of knowledge (God can make up for that); it is that we will fall into idolatry and neglect our God, thereby neglecting the true needs of our children.
