 - 1. Webster's definition the act of becoming formed again
 - 2. "Born again" John 3:3
 - 3. "Born of the spirit" John 3:5

 - ii. The Nature of Regeneration
 - 1. A spiritual change
 - a. produced by the spirit of God
 - b. takes place in the spirit of the person
 - 2. Changes the disposition of the heart
 - a. controlling the exercise of the affections
 - b. controls the choice of the will
 - c. "darkness to light" Ephesians 5:8
 - d. deposits love in the heart I John 4:7
 - e. formerly dead Ephesians 2:1; now alive Ephesians 2:5
 - iii. The Necessity of Regeneration
 - 1. depravity renders regeneration necessary
 - 2. man must be changed Ephesians 4:18-19
 - 3. necessary to be children of God John 1:13
 - 4. "Ye must be born again" John 3:7
 - iv. The Agent of Regeneration
 - 1. The Holy Spirit
 - a. "It is the spirit that quickeneth" John 6:63
 - b. "written with the Spirit...... in the heart" II Corinthians 3:3

- 2. A spiritual operation by God Himself
 - a. Ezekiel 36:26
- v. The Means of Regeneration
 - 1. The Word of God
 - a. "begotten you through the Gospel" I Corinthians 4:15
 - b. "begat He us with the Word of Truth" James 1:18
 - c. "born again, by the Word of God" I Peter 1:23
 - 2. Harmony requires the Holy Spirit as agent and the Word of God as the instrument used
- vi. How is Regeneration Accomplished?
 - 1. We cannot understand
 - a. John 3:8
 - b. Deuteronomy 29:29
 - 2. To be born is an everlasting calamity unless we are born again

II. Repentance

- i. An Important Biblical Theme
 - 1. John the Baptist preached it Matthew 3:1-2
 - 2. Jesus preached it Mark 1:15
 - 3. Apostles preached it Mark 6:12, Acts 2:38, Acts 3:19
 - 4. Paul preached it Acts 17:30, Acts 20:21
- ii. Greek work metanoeo
 - 1. After-thought (2nd thought following sin)
 - 2. Change of mind/heart
 - 3. Repentance applies to the mind/heart, not life
 - a. reformation follows repentance
 - b. "fruits meet for repentance"
- iii. A Consciousness of Personal Sin
 - 1. "Personal" in that you can not repent for another's sin
 - 2. A sense of sin that pervades the soul
 - a. conviction
 - b. John 16:7-9
- iv. Recognize That Sin is an Inexcusable Evil Committed Against God
 - 1. Psalms 51:4
 - 2. Not merely a misfortune, but a crime
 - 3. A deep sense of shame is the result
- v. Hatred of Sin
 - 1. Both corrupt nature and actual sins
 - 2. Self-loathing

- vi. Sorrow for Sin
 - 1. Mathew 11:20-21
 - 2. II Corinthians 7:10
 - 3. **Psalms 51:17**
- vii. A Purpose to Forsake Sin
 - 1. Naturally following iii thru vi above
 - 2. Without this you have not fulfilled "hatred of" and "sorrow for"

III. Faith

- i. There is a Faith That Does Not Save
 - 1. "can faith save him?" James 2:14
 - a.a dead faith cannot save
 - b.a living faith leads to action (works)
 - 2. "the devils also believe" James 2:19
 - a.theirs is a dead faith (mental agreement)
 - 3. "for a while believe" Luke 8:13
 - 4. "believe to the saving of the soul" Hebrews 10:39
- ii. Saving Faith
 - 1. John 3:14-18 & John 11:25-26
 - a.believe in Jesus Christ
 - b.trust
 - c. as personal an act as dying
- IV. Faith and Repentance
 - i. Acts 20:21
 - 1. Repentance toward God
 - 2. Faith toward our Lord Jesus Christ
 - ii. Simultaneous and Inseparable
 - 1. No regenerated unbelievers
 - a. No unregenerated believers
